MERSEY FERRIES AND LIVERPOOL

MONDAY 16th APRIL, 2012

At the end of last year, the Queen officially opened the latest Museum to be built in this Country. It is the Liverpool Museum, a magnificent building set on the newly constructed beautiful Waterfront. It is all about Liverpool and demonstrates the city's unique contribution to the world and showcases its popular culture while tackling social, historical and contemporary issues. It was opened exactly 100 years after the Royal Liver Building.



The galleries and floors are wonderful - and there is plenty of seating from where you can look both ways up and down the river.

The whole of the newly built Waterfront is most impressive and there are lots of benches overlooking the Mersey - so plenty of places to sit comfortably and picnic if you wish. It is also only a stone's throw from 'Liverpool 1' and the Maritime Museum.

Anxious as we were to see this new Museum, we decided not to approach it directly by road but from the water and, not having been on a "ferry 'cross the Mersey", we drive to Seacombe, on the Wirral, and cross to Pier Head on 'The River Explorer'. On the return journey we enjoy the views looking towards the Wirral side of the Mersey. The total round journey on the water lasts 50 minutes and has a commentary indicating the points of interest.

The new Liverpool cruise liner docking point is now open too. If we are lucky we may be able to see a liner there.

The return ferry from Pier Head leaves at 3.00pm - do make sure that you catch this as our coach will be waiting for us on the other side of the river!!

We shall have a tea stop somewhere on the Wirral on the way home.

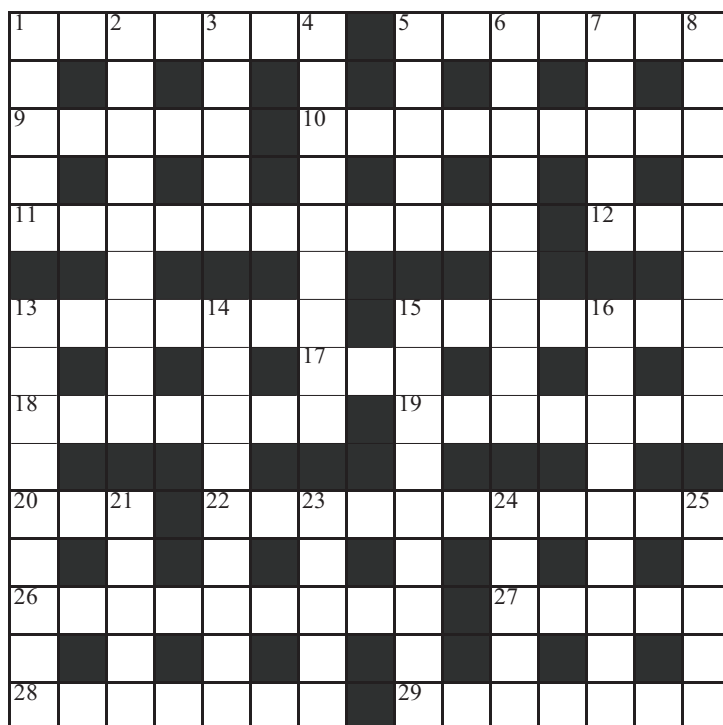
